





# Yr 6 Orientation – Dorrigo High School – Tomorrow - Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> November – All Day

Tomorrow, Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> November, Year 6 will be heading to Dorrigo High School where they will participate in a full day of lessons. They will need recess and lunch.
