# FIRE FACTS from the DORRIGO PLATEAU RURAL FIRE BRIGADES

The Dorrigo Plateau Rural Fire Brigades comprise Bostobrick, Deervale, Megan and Tyringham brigades. RFS brigades are grouped in Local Council areas so Tyringham is in Clarence Valley Council area whereas the other brigades are in the Bellingen Shire. Together we try to protect the residents who live in the rural areas of the Dorrigo Plateau from bushfire. Fire & Rescue NSW [FRNSW] firefighters respond to house fires in Dorrigo. Both services can attend rural house fires, motor vehicle accidents and other incidents if required.

The RFS volunteer firefighters on the Plateau are part of the 70,000 volunteers across NSW. There is a much smaller number of paid staff, mostly in administration roles in District Offices around the state and at RFS Headquarters in Sydney. Together we form a vital part of the Emergency Services Network of NSW.

The roles of RFS volunteers are many and varied. Of course the most obvious and visible is the yellow uniformed firefighter on the end of a hose fighting a fire. There are many other less visible roles, communications, aviation support, catering and Remote Area Firefighting Teams. One of the less well known roles is Community Engagement and Education.

To try and remedy this, over the next few months leading up to the next fire permit season we'll be writing a small weekly column bringing you tips and tricks to prepare your property against bushfires, things to do and not to do if you need to burn, useful hints to help you to help us if we have to attend your property. The Dorrigo Plateau Rural Fire Brigades have a Facebook page where we'll be posting these weekly articles [usually with pictures] as well as other helpful fire and community information.
