We only have a small supply of spare clothing in certain sizes here at school and do not want students to go cold.

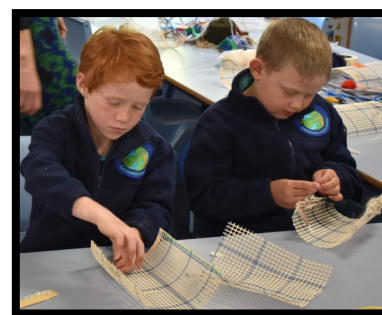
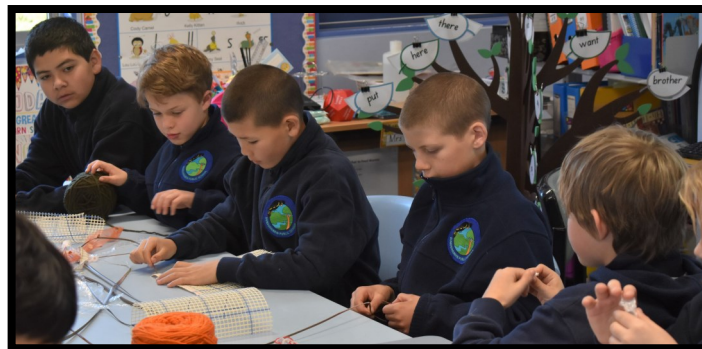
If your child borrows a clothing item, please wash it and return it to as soon as possible so we can replenish our supplies.
